WORKSHOPS

NANCY CUCCI WORKSHOP – IRRESISTIBLE IRIDENSCENTS

Hope everyone is having an easy time working on the pre-stitching for Nancy's Irresistible Iridescents. I know there are a few over achievers who have already completed theirs.

Just a few reminders for those who are participating:

- Class is Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 22 and 23, from 9 4 at the Mini-Time Machine Museum of Miniatures.
- We will ordering lunch from Baggins each morning. Please remember to bring cash to make the money collection run smoothly.
- Water and snacks will be provided. A Keurig coffee maker will be available, so bring your favorite brew or some k-cups will be provided.
- Please bring the following: any Kreinik left from your pre-stitching, laying tool, 22, 24, and 26 tapestry needles, #10 beading needles, embroidery scissors, your usual stitching supplies, stand or clamps to stabilize the frame.
- Nancy recommends that you also bring magnification and light for threading the beading needles.

Looking forward to a fun and educational workshop.

LORENE SALT WORKSHOP - AUTUMN KALEIDOSCOPE

February 1 and 2, 2019, Friday and Saturday, 9:00 am - 4:00 pm at the Mini Time Machine Museum of Miniatures

"Autumn Kaleidoscope" is a study in String Art and "Spirograph" type stitches. When the design is finished it begins to take on the look of shards of colored glass, which one would see while looking through a Kaleidoscope. The student will put the Star Stitch/Smyrna grid in place as pre-stitching. There are over 50 different stitches including various types of Jessicas, Amadeus, Sprats Head, Balloon, Waffles, and Chilly Hollow in this piece. Techniques include Bargello, Diaper Patterns, and Laid Fillings. The piece is further embellished with Swarovski crystals and pearls. This class will appeal to those students who would like to try new techniques while challenging themselves by mastering complex canvaswork stitches.

Proficiency Level: Intermediate/Advanced Maximum of 20 students Ghosts are allowed

Design size: 9 1/4" x 9 1/4" on 18-count black mono canvas

Pre-work required

Kit cost: \$200 (there is an extensive list of threads, crystals and pearls)

Registration Deadline: Saturday, November 17, at the holiday potluck
