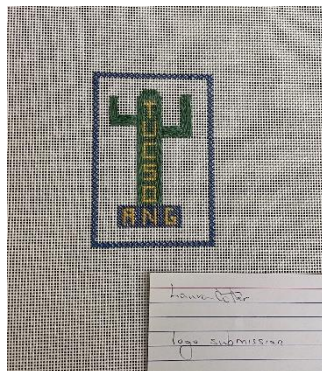

Meeting Highlights – March 28, 2024

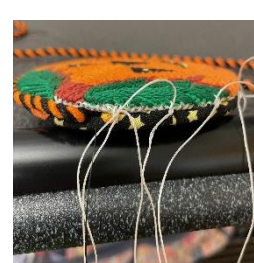
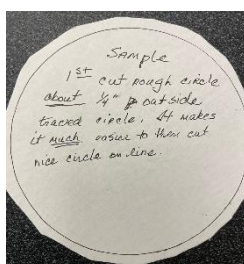
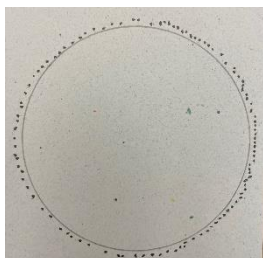
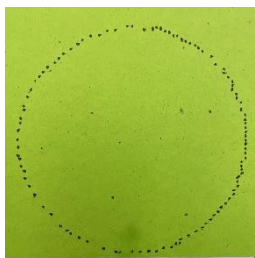

MEET EARLA SWOPE

Our eldest member, Earla Swope of Green Valley, is 101! Her next birthday is in August.

Earla was born in Havana, Illinois. After high school she went to business school in Chicago where she learned secretarial skills, especially shorthand. She worked for many, many years and her last job was working for Illinois state Senator John Marlo.

Earla doesn't remember when or how she started stitching. She did attend classes and when she was still in Illinois she started attending the ANG seminars.

She had two children. Her son moved to Galesburg Illinois, from Green Valley, a few years ago. Her daughter Dale Miller passed away a few years ago. Dale was an award-winning stitcher and belonged to our guild and lived in Green Valley.

Earla was a charter member of our guild and was very active both in our chapter and in the Cactus Wrens of Green Valley.

Earla hasn't stitched in over ten years due to blindness from macular degeneration.

She now lives at "La Posada at Green Valley" and says she is getting excellent care.
